Cutting

Gold Leaf Print

- (24) 3 7/8" squares
- (20) 3" squares

Teal Plaid

- (24) 3 7/8" squares

Cream Print

- (48) 3 7/8" squares; cut each square once diagonally to yield (96) triangles

Teal Allover

- (12) 9" squares

Green Leaf Print

- (3) 12 1/2" x 42" strips; crosscut into (31) 3" x 12 1/2" sashing strips

Green Sprig

- (7) 2 1/2" x 42" inner-border strips

Teal Stripe

- (2) 5" x 65" lengthwise strips*
- (2) 5" x 79" lengthwise strips*
- (4) 2 1/2" x 78" binding strips

* Center the motif in the middle of each strip. Before you cut, make sure you have four identical repeats from the section that you choose.

Cutting

Gold Leaf Print

- (24) 3 7/8" squares
- (20) 3" squares

Brown Plaid

- (24) 3 7/8" squares

Cream Print

- (48) 3 7/8" squares; cut each square once diagonally to yield (96) triangles

Brown Allover

- (12) 9" squares

Brown Leaf Print

- (3) 12 1/2" x 42" strips; crosscut into (31) 3" x 12 1/2" sashing strips

Gold Tossed

- (7) 2 1/2" x 42" inner-border strips

Brown Stripe

- (2) 5" x 65" lengthwise strips*
- (2) 5" x 79" lengthwise strips*
- (4) 2 1/2" x 78" binding strips

* Center the motif in the middle of each strip. Before you cut, make sure you have four identical repeats from the section that you choose.

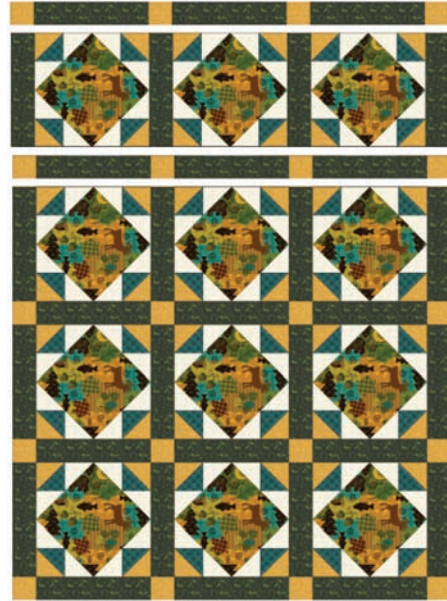
Block Assembly

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each $3\frac{7}{8}$ " gold leaf square. Layer a marked square with the teal plaid squares, right sides together, and stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " from each side of the marked line. Cut the squares apart on the drawn line. Press the seam allowances toward the dark triangle. Trim to $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square if needed. Make 48 half-square-triangle units.
2. Sew a cream triangle to adjacent sides of each half-square triangle unit to make a corner unit as shown in the block diagram. Make 48 corner units.
3. Sew a corner unit to opposite sides of a 9" teal all-over print square. Sew corner units to the remaining sides of the square to complete the block. Make 12 blocks, each measuring $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ ".



Quilt Assembly

1. Lay out the blocks, the 3" x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " green leaf sashing strips, and the 3" gold leaf squares in rows as shown. Sew together the pieces in each row, pressing the seam allowances toward the sashing strips. Sew the rows together to complete the quilt center and press.



2. Sew the green sprig $2\frac{1}{2}$ " - wide inner-border strips together end to end. From this strip, cut two 61" long strips and sew them to the sides of the quilt top. Cut two $50\frac{1}{2}$ " - long strips and sew them to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press the seam allowances toward the just-added border.
3. Center and pin the shorter teal stripe 5" - wide strips to the top and bottom edges of the quilt top. Sew the strips from seam point to seam point and backstitch at the beginning and end of the seam. Add the longer 5" - wide strips to the sides of the quilt in the same manner. Press the seam allowances toward the borders. Finish the corners with mitered seams. Press these seams open.
4. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing; baste. Quilt as desired. Bind the edges to finish.
